The Journal Square campus sits in the center of Jersey City, next to a major PATH station and transportation hub, while the North Hudson Campus in Union City sits adjacent to a vital light rail station; the Secaucus campus has abundant parking.

Fully accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education, the College offers courses and classes in a wide variety of disciplines to the people and businesses of Hudson County, one of the most historic and ethnically diverse areas of the United States. Position Summary:

The College Lecturer/Clinical Nurse Specialist is a full-time, twelve-month (12) position that will be responsible for successfully performing the following professional duties during a consecutive five-day work week that does not exceed seven hours per day. Provide both didactic and clinical instruction.

Position Responsibilities:

- A. Teach a minimum of 18 credits per calendar year.
- B. Hold a minimum of 3 posted office hours per week
- C. Advise Students and Register Students (cohort of 28).
- D. Participate in:
 - Student learning outcomes assessment activities
 - Accreditation activities (establish and/or maintain)
 - Discipline and school meetings
 - Colloquia
 - Commencement
 - College Committee work, including course and program review
- E. Maintain active involvement with:
 - Student engagement through the use of individual and group student discussion meetings, regularly scheduled student tutoring sessions, and regularly scheduled student advising sessions.
 - Student Community Service opportunities and Student Service learning through development of student service learning and community services opportunities, recruitment of students to participate in service learning and community service and supervision of students involved in service learning and community service opportunities.

- F. Mentor adjunct faculty, including classroom observation responsibilities.
- G. Participate in curriculum development and revision.
- H. Perform other professional duties as directed and/or approved by the Vice President of Academic Affairs.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Licensed Registered Professional Nursing in the State of New Jersey.
- Bachelor's Degree in Nursing; Master's degree in Nursing (preferred) from a regionally accredited institution of higher education.
- Three years of clinical practice as a nurse in an acute and/or long term care facility.
- Two years college-level teaching experience, preferably at the community college level, preferred; Experience teaching in the specific discipline.
- Demonstrated knowledge of modern pedagogical technology and its use in the classroom.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills.
- Demonstrated ability to provide diverse teaching methods to differing learning styles.
- Demonstrated excellence in teaching and the ability to teach students from diverse academic, socioeconomic, cultural, and ethnic backgrounds.
