Transfer Glossary: Types of Agreements

Listed below are the most common types of transfer agreements and how each of them works. If you have any questions, please contact the Office of Transfer Pathways.

Articulation Agreement	<p>An articulation agreement is an agreement that goes into detail about things such as</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Guaranteed admission • Acceptance of transfer credits • Eligibility for scholarships • Academic course requirements <p>These agreements help to provide students with a step-by-step guide for completing necessary course requirements and transferring credits to another school.</p>
Dual Admissions	<p>Dual Admissions is when a student is admitted to two institutions at the same time. For example, a student can be seeking a degree at HCCC and already admitted to a four-year transfer institution, with access to their campus and services. Their HCCC classes would then transfer to the four-year institution, once they complete their Associate's Degree.</p>
2+2 Agreements	<p>2 years at the community college and 2 years at the four-year institution.) 2+2 programs are designed for students who take half of a degree at one institution and the second half at another institution. Usually, this is completing an associate degree at a community college and transferring into a four-year institution for bachelor's degree completion. A student's enrollment status may cause an agreement like this to vary in length.</p>
3+1 Agreements	<p>(3 years at the community college and 1 year at the four-year institution.) A student earns their associate degree at a community college, stays for an additional year at the college as they take upper-level coursework, then transfers in their final year to the four-year institution to complete their bachelor's degree. These pathways, designed by both the community college and university, minimize the risks associated with the transfer and set learners up for success.</p>
Reverse Transfer	<p>Reverse transfer is when students transfer credits back to a previously attended institution to complete a degree even after leaving that institution. These agreements realize that students often transfer before completing a degree. Institutions collaborate closely, obtaining necessary paperwork and submitting the official transcripts for formal awarding of the degree. Students are encouraged to complete their Associates degree to maximize transfer credit and reduce cost.</p>

Transfer Roadmap: Student Timeline

The transfer student timeline is a comprehensive guide that outlines the various stages and key milestones a student typically experiences when transitioning to a new educational institution. This timeline serves as a valuable resource for transfer students, providing them with a clear understanding of what to expect during their journey. Whether you are considering transferring or have already embarked on this path, this timeline will serve as a valuable roadmap to ensure a smooth and successful transition to your new educational destination.

<p>Early Stages (0-15 credits):</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research: Start researching potential transfer universities and their transfer requirements, including GPA, prerequisite courses, and application deadlines. Consider factors such as location, program offerings, and financial aid options. • Academic Advising: Meet with an academic advisor at the college to discuss your transfer goals. They can guide you on the appropriate courses to take and ensure you are on track to meet transfer requirements. • General Education Courses: Focus on completing your general education requirements, as these are typically transferable to most universities. Consult with your advisor to determine which courses fulfill these requirements.
<p>Mid-Stages (15-30 credits):</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Target Schools & Career Services: Narrow down your list of potential transfer universities based on your research and personal preferences. Visit their websites and attend transfer information sessions or college fairs to gather more information. Additionally, reach out to your community college's career services department for guidance on how your academic choices align with your long-term career goals. They can provide insights into which universities offer programs that best match your desired career path. • Major Exploration: If you have an idea of your intended major, start exploring the prerequisite courses required by your target universities. Ensure that you are taking the necessary courses at your community college. • Maintain GPA: Aim to maintain a competitive GPA, as many universities have minimum GPA requirements for transfer students. Strive for a GPA above the minimum requirement to enhance your chances of acceptance.
<p>Preparing for Transfer (30-45 credits):</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Transfer Agreements: Check if your community college has any transfer agreements or articulation agreements with specific universities. These agreements outline the courses that will transfer and fulfill major requirements at the receiving institution. • Visit Transfer Offices: Visit the Transfer Pathways office at the college and the universities you are interested in to seek guidance and ensure you are on track. They can provide information on transfer scholarships, housing options, and other resources. Additionally, check in with your academic advisor during this stage to discuss your progress, ensure you're meeting the necessary academic requirements, and get their input on your transfer plans. • Extracurricular Activities: Engage in extracurricular activities, such as clubs or volunteer work, to enhance your transfer application. These activities demonstrate your involvement and commitment outside of academics.
<p>Application and Final Stages (45-60 credits):</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Application Deadlines: Be aware of transfer application deadlines for your target universities. Start working on your application well in advance to ensure you have enough time to gather necessary documents, such as transcripts and recommendation letters. • Personal Statement: Begin drafting your personal statement, highlighting your academic achievements, extracurricular activities, and reasons for transferring. Seek feedback from advisors, professors, or mentors to strengthen your statement. • Financial Aid: Research and apply for financial aid and scholarships specific to transfer students. Contact the financial aid offices at both your community college and the transfer universities to explore your options. • Check with Registrar Office regarding Graduation: As you approach the completion of your community college coursework, check with the Registrar's Office to ensure you are on track for graduation. They can provide guidance on any final requirements and procedures. To complete the graduation process, follow these steps: Visit HCCC.edu-Click on the menu-Select "Student Success"-Click on "Graduation Application."



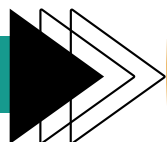

Can you share your reasons for starting your academic journey at a community college and then transferring to a university? What factors influenced this decision?

Short answer is flexibility. A community college offered greater flexibility. Both logistically and personally. The tuition cost at HCCC was a fraction of what a university typically costs. I also had the option to explore co-curricular activities, such as the Computer Science club, Phi Theta Kappa and the Peer Leader program which all enabled me to develop leadership skills. These activities kept me engaged with my peers and professors.

What steps did you take to ensure a smooth transition from community college to university? Were there any specific challenges you faced during this process, and how did you overcome them?

I utilized the resources that were available - career services, academic advisors and peers that were in the process of transferring to a 4-year. Speaking with different people allowed me to develop a broader perspective of the transfer process and what to expect. My transfer process was smooth. I don't feel there was a challenge at all because of the support system that I had with me. I highly recommend that students find people who they are comfortable with so that they can seek the support they need.

Can you describe the support resources or programs that were available to you as a transfer student, both at the community college and the university? How did these resources contribute to your success?

I felt confident about my transition due to the leadership skills I developed at Hudson. I knew that I would face challenges during my transition to a university since I was entering a new environment. But my experience at Hudson showed me that a support system is critical to academic success, therefore, I took the time to get to know my classmates and professors. That enabled me to feel at ease in my new academic setting.

How did your experience at the community college prepare you for the academic rigor and expectations of the university? Were there any notable differences you encountered, and how did you adapt to them?

Academic advising, career services and America needs you. I received mentorship from people who were ahead in their studies or had graduated already with a bachelor's degree.

Looking back at your journey from community college to university, what advice would you give to other students considering a similar path? Are there any specific strategies or tips you found helpful in maximizing your transfer experience?

Find your support system. Make friends. Enjoy the process because it goes fast. Your academic journey doesn't have to be dry where you go home and go to school and do what your told in the classroom. You have the potential to do so much more..




