



Meet Hudson County Community College Foundation Chair Ronnie Sevilla

Ronnie Sevilla took over as Chair of the Hudson County Community College Foundation this year, but he's not new to serving others or to the value of education. Sevilla steps into the leading role of Foundation Chair after serving as Treasurer and as a dedicated member of the

Foundation Board for nearly a decade. He is currently the Vice President and a Cash Management and Sales Officer at Spencer Savings Bank.

There are many ways that Sevilla could choose to serve the community, so why the HCCC Foundation?

Sevilla holds a Bachelor of Arts in Economics from Rutgers University and earned an Executive MBA from Rutgers Business School. His experience in business school played a large part in forming his views about the importance of education. Sevilla states, "Look at me, I went back to school later in life. I loved the experience, and I'm a better person for it. I want everyone to have the opportunity to experience the life-changing effect of a college education."

The New Foundation Chair is also a strong believer that education creates social and economic mobility in the community, pointing out that "Education is the gift that keeps on giving; it's intergenerational. A college education helps people to break the cycle and empowers them to have more control over their future."

HCCC's Hudson Scholars Thrive with Donor Support



A \$100,000 Signature Grant from Provident Bank Foundation (PBF) made a profound impact on the lives of over 400 HCCC students who participated in the award-winning Hudson Scholars program and are now graduates.

The Hudson Scholars Program expands access to educational opportunities for Hudson County students and significantly improves the academic outcomes these students achieve. "The Hudson Scholars program is groundbreaking," says Samantha Plotino, Executive Director of The Provident Bank Foundation, "and we believe it to be the ideal model for community colleges nationwide to abate the challenges that might delay or prevent students from graduating."

Developed under the visionary leadership of HCCC President Dr. Christopher Reber, the award-winning Hudson Scholars Program expands academic access and drives student success through a unique combination of proactive academic advisement, financial stipends, high-impact educational experiences, and early academic intervention. Students

can use these monthly stipends to pay for needs beyond tuition including books and transportation to and from classes.

Many students enrolled in Hudson Scholars face significant barriers to academic success, whether it's navigating financial challenges, working to put through college, themselves responsibilities, or food and housing insecurity. In the fall of 2023, when PBF began its support of the program, 34% of HCCC students were adult learners, 55% identified as Hispanic or Latino, and 88% self-identified as non-white. Over threequarters of first-time, full-time HCCC students place into English as a Second Language (ESL), Developmental English, or Developmental Math courses, and 80% qualify for Federal financial aid.

The results are a testament to the program's effectiveness. 21% of Fall 2021 Hudson Scholars graduated within two years, over triple the number from 2018-2020. Hudson Scholars has made its greatest impact on students from traditionally underrepresented communities.

Students like Nina appreciated the belief and support from their advisors, which expanded their horizons and pushed them to go beyond what they previously thought they were capable of. This belief and support led to significant academic and personal growth for students like Nina, who reflected that "Being here gave me a lot of opportunities to better myself and express myself more. I was able to explore more things and become more involved on campus. I recently became Student Government President. I never expected to be in this position, but HCCC gave me the opportunity. Hudson Scholars gives you a lot of confidence in yourself and makes you realize nothing is impossible. My advisor has been a great mentor for me - whenever I felt like I was on the verge of failing, he made me realize I could succeed."
