Dear Friends and Supporters,



Golfers Beat the Heat to Raise Scholarships for Students at the HCCC Foundation Golf Outing



The HCCC Foundation held its 23rd annual golf outing on June 23 at the beautiful Brooklake Country Club in Florham Park. The event was a success as Foundation Board members and leadership, local business leaders from a variety of companies, and community members came together to brave the heat and raise money for a great cause – scholarships for HCCC students.



The temperature, which reached over 100 degrees, didn't stop over 70 golfers from hitting the fairways and enjoying a great day of fun and networking. Altogether, the event grossed revenue of over \$80,000 for student scholarships, ensuring that the impact of the outing will last far beyond a day of golf – it will be felt for years to come as these students get the chance to pursue their educational and career goals without the burden of worrying how they will pay for it.

HCCC Student Golfers Learn Lifelong Skills; Make Lifelong Memories



In addition to generating significant funding for scholarships, the Foundation's golf outing created another benefit for students. Thanks to a generous donation from Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield, who sponsored the student golf clinic, 10 enthusiastic HCCC students received the opportunity to learn how to play the great game of golf for the first time.

The golf clinic consisted of five visits to Jersey City's Skyway Golf Course, where students learned the game and got pointers from the club's pro, Steve Mills.

The vibrant students, who did not know each other beforehand, enthusiastically embraced the chance to make new friends and valuable contacts for the future as they bonded over the challenge of learning a new skill together for the first time. Several of the students even met up at Skyway to build camaraderie and further hone their skills together.

In addition to learning how to drive, chip, and putt, the student golfers also gained valuable social capital for the future by getting comfortable on a golf course, a place where lots of networking and dealmaking takes place in the business world, and one that would have been out of reach for many of these students if not for the clinic. Golf Committee Chair and Foundation Board Member Steve Mullen stated

that "the participation of the student golfers made the outing more special. It gave the event added meaning and purpose." After the outing, the student golfers also wrote thank you notes to the sponsors who made this experience possible.

Reflecting on the clinic, Skyway's Steve Mills remarked, "What an amazing experience watching people who never picked up a club accelerate through the class like they did. With open minds, anything can happen, and it did. Within an hour, we watched (student golfer) Vivian go from not being able to make contact to hitting a high soft pitch shot onto the green from 50 yards, and they were on target. Ana, another student who really developed a knack for the game, and already progressed to the point where she is golf course ready. She hits the ball with power and in the correct direction."

These are just a couple of the highlights that stand out in my mind. But most importantly, the students getting together and forming a group practice is what it is all about. Coming to the course with your friends and entering into friendly competition and learning together. Golf is not an easy game to learn as an adult. But, with an open mind and perseverance, anything can be accomplished. The smiles and laughter of the students was infectious."

HCCC's Valedictorian is a HCCC Foundation Scholarship Recipient!



The 2025 graduating class was the largest in the College's history, as over 1,550 HCCC students earned their degrees at HCCC's 48th annual Commencement ceremony, held at Sports Illustrated Stadium in Harrison, New Jersey.

Each graduate put in the hard work, overcame obstacles, and traversed their own unique road to get to this special day, including Class of 2025 valedictorian Lidia Khayrulina. Not only was Lydia the valedictorian, she was also the recipient of a scholarship from the HCCC Foundation.

Lidia is a first-generation Russian immigrant who learned about HCCC and its offerings while working for a local newspaper. As an immigrant and ESL student, Lidia overcame doubts about the language barrier and being a nontraditional college student to excel at HCCC, where she mastered English, immersed herself in College life, and excelled in her classes on her way to earning an Associate of Science degree in Business Administration.

Lidia was a 2025 Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship Semifinalist, and New Jersey Council of County Colleges "New Jersey Student of the Year" nominee. She is a member of Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Honor Society, the PTK New Jersey All-State Academic Team,
