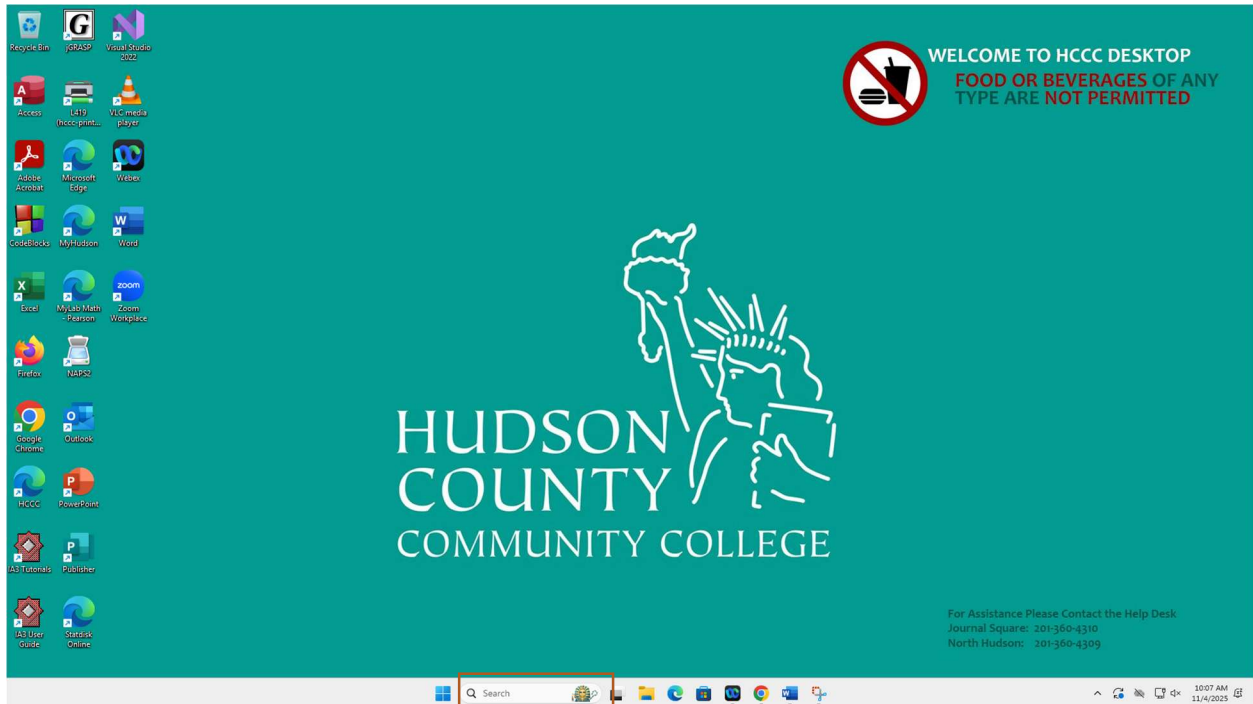

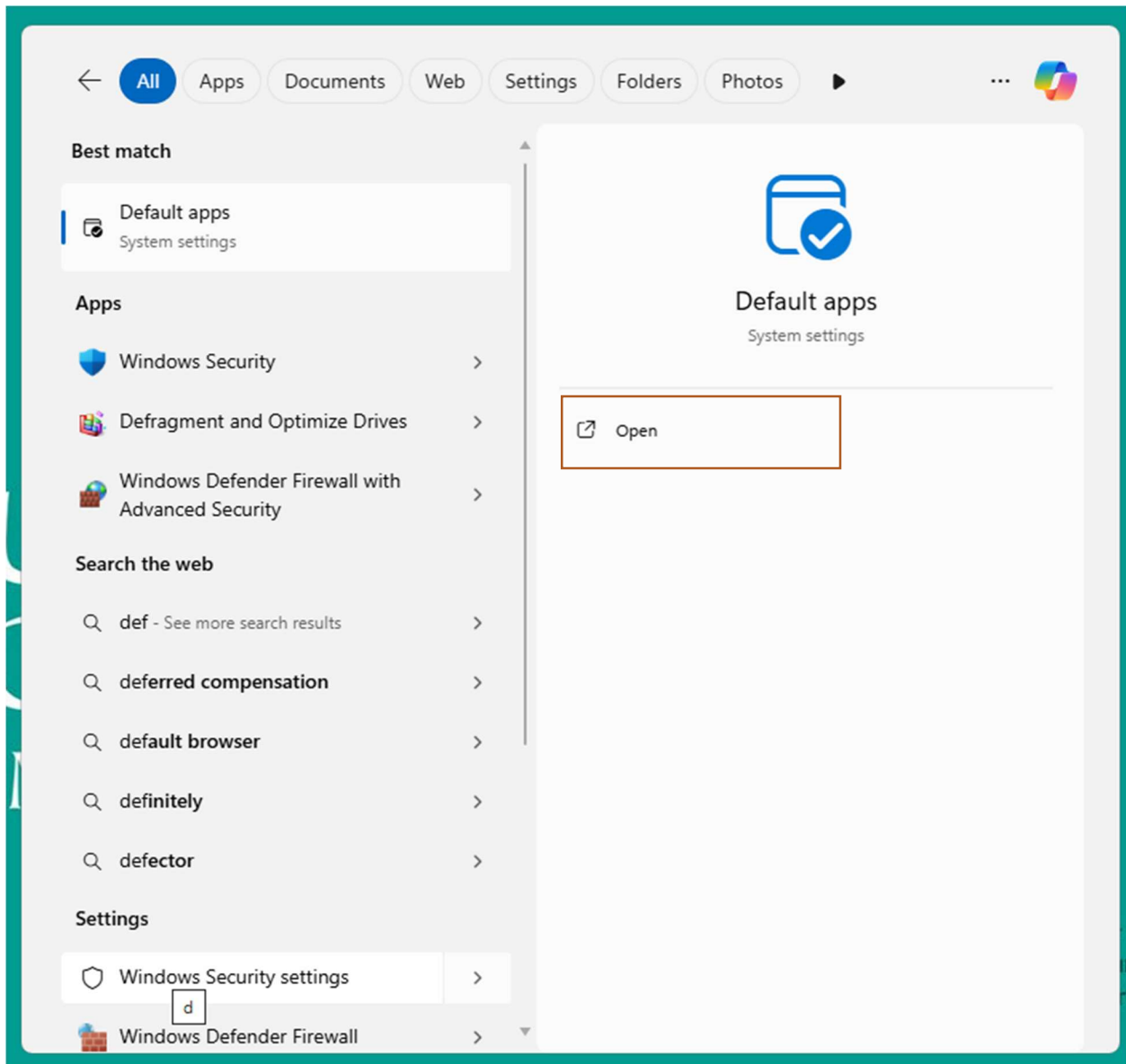
Making Adobe Acrobat the default PDF App on your PC

*After these steps you will be able to sign, edit and read digital documents on your computer.

STEP 1: Click on the desktop search bar



STEP 2: Type “default apps” and open to change settings



STEP 3: Click on Adobe Acrobat App
