Scholarship Event - Our annual scholarship event took place on October 27 engaging 31 students to apply for scholarships and learn how to write an essay. Christine Petersen and Assistant Professor Kathryn Buckley presented at the event.

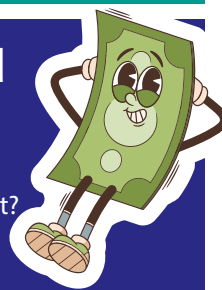

Best Practices Corner

Attend all classes from the beginning.

Apply Early: Complete your 2026-2027 FAFSA now to maximize your eligibility for grants and limited funding programs.

Glossary of Financial Aid terms Continues:

Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) - New Jersey's community college free tuition program based on eligible criteria. Students must file the FAFSA or NJ Dreamers Alternative Application to determine eligibility. Go to hesaa.org for more information.

Tuition Aid Grant (TAG) – Needs based assistance to New Jersey students enrolled at approved New Jersey higher education institutions. Students must complete the

FAFSA or NJ Dreamers Alternative Application to determine eligibility.

Need-Based Aid – Financial assistance provided to students based on their financial situation, determined by completing the FAFSA. Need-based financial aid can take different forms, including grants, scholarships, work-study programs, and low-interest loans, like the federal direct subsidized loan.
