Transfer Glossary: Types of Agreements

Listed below are the most common types of transfer agreements and how each of them works. If you have any questions, please contact the Office of Transfer Pathways.

Articulation Agreement	• Eligibility for scholarships		
Dual Admissions	Dual Admissions is when a student is admitted to two institutions at the same time. For example, a student can be seeking a degree at HCCC and already admitted to a four-year transfer institution, with access to their campus and services. Their HCCC classes would then transfer to the four-year institution, once they complete their Associate's Degree.		
2+2 Agreements	2 years at the community college and 2 years at the four-year institution.) 2+2 programs are designed for students who take half of a degree at one institution and the second half at another institution. Usually, this is completing an associate degree at a community college and transferring into a four-year institution for bachelor's degree completion. A student's enrollment status may cause an agreement like this to vary in length.		
3+1 Agreements	(3 years at the community college and 1 year at the four-year institution.) A student earns their associate degree at a community college, stays for an additional year at the college as they take upper-level coursework, then transfers in their final year to the four-year institution to complete their bachelor's degree. These pathways, designed by both the community college and university, minimize the risks associated with the transfer and set learners up for success.		
Reverse Transfer	Reverse transfer is when students transfer credits back to a previously attended institution to complete a degree even after leaving that institution. These agreements realize that students often transfer before completing a degree. Institutions collaborate closely, obtaining necessary paperwork and submitting the official transcripts for formal awarding of the degree. Students are encouraged to complete their Associates degree to maximize transfer credit and reduce cost.

What is the HCCC | NJCU CONNECT Program?

CONNECT is an exciting partnership between Hudson County Community College (HCCC) and New Jersey City University (NJCU). Students in the CONNECT program will receive personalized support and services to streamline the transfer process from HCCC to NJCU.

Benefits of CONNECT

- Tuition Cost Savings! Based on your income, your degree may be tuition-free!
 - The New Jersey College Promise offers an affordable pathway to a college degree. Together, the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) and the Garden State Guarantee (GSG) programs promise transparent, predictable pricing for up to four years of college here in New Jersey.
- Every Credit Counts! A specialized, aligned curriculum from HCCC to NJCU ensures all HCCC credits transfer toward your selected NJCU degree program.
- Dedicated Success Coaches. Transfer Success Coaches provide continuous support and guidance from your enrollment at HCCC to your graduation from NJCU.
- CONNECT = Access. As a CONNECT student, you will have access to facilities and events at both colleges, including housing and sporting events at NJCU.
- No Additional Application. Earn your associate degree at HCCC and then seamlessly transition to earn your bachelor's degree at NJCU with no additional application or fees required.
- CONNECT Your Career. Enjoy special internship and co-curricular experiences that will prepare you for career success.

Who Should Consider Being CONNECTed?

CONNECT is available to current HCCC students who:

- Are enrolled in an eligible CONNECT degree program pathway.
- · Have a GPA of 2.0 or higher.
- Have earned between 0 and 30 college credits at HCCC.
- Enroll in at least 9 credits per semester at HCCC.
- Complete the CONNECT Declaration Form.

Transfer Success Coach: Madeline Fermin



Can you share with us a few resources that helped you succeed in college as a student?

As a commuter student and later at the same time working full time, I knew it was important to take advantage of all the resources the college offered to be successful. I spent a lot of time in the college library. NJCU library was then and currently accommodates students, with spacious and comfortable group and individual study rooms. It allowed me to form study groups with my classmates. The library was always my go-to place to do my research paper, study for midterms and finals. During my time in school, I knew it was also important to have good time management skills. By offering individualized guidance, addressing concerns promptly, and providing a sense of community, I aim to enhance the overall experience of students interested in applying to the HCCC/NJCU CONNECT program.

What advice would you give current HCCC students who are planning to continue their education after HCCC?

My advice for current HCCC students planning to continue their education after completing their studies is to plan and be well-informed to assure a successful transition to a four-year institution. Students should attend transfer fairs, open houses, information sessions, and other events that enable direct interaction with representatives from four-year institutions. This will help students gather information, ask questions, and make informed decisions about their transfer options. I would also advise students to take advantage of all the resources offered to them as future transfer students to maintain a strong academic standing. By following this advice and being part of the HCCC/NJCU CONNECT, students can start continuing their education after community college with confidence and preparation, ensuring a successful academic experience.

My name is Anthony Figueroa, and I earned my associate degree in biology (science and mathematics) in 2022 from Hudson County Community College (HCCC). Subsequently, I transferred to New Jersey City University (NJCU) to pursue my bachelor's degree in biology. These two academic institutions have proven invaluable in providing the support and preparedness necessary for my future. My current aim is to gain acceptance into medical school, and the knowledge I gained from both HCCC and NJCU has set me on the right path. One notable benefit of being a transfer student from HCCC is that, based on my performance, I could obtain the transfer presidential scholarship at NJCU. This scholarship has significantly eased financial burdens, allowing me to focus primarily on my studies. As I move forward in my academic journey, I am grateful for the foundation and opportunities these institutions have provided, positioning me for success in my pursuit of being admitted in medical school.

What motivated you to transfer from HCCC to NJCU?

The decision to transfer from Hudson County Community College to New Jersey City University was driven by my aspiration to continue with my academic journey and have a better comprehension of biology. In addition, I enrolled into NJCU because of its diverse, supportive, and affordable educational environment, presenting an opportunity for not only academic advancement but also personal and professional growth.

How did you navigate the transfer process, and were there specific resources or support services at HCCC and NJCU that played a crucial role in your successful transition?

Transferring between educational institutions initially posed challenges, which caused the process to be somewhat confusing and stressful. However, this transfer process facilitated by advisors at HCCC and the collaborative efforts of NJCU's admissions department, transfer resource center and financial aid office were essential in smoothing out the difficulties of the transition. Their unwavering support enabled me to identify and fulfill all necessary requirements, including transcripts and essays, and provided essential information regarding available scholarships.

In your experience, what advice would you give other students who are considering transferring to the NJCU?

For students thinking about transferring to NJCU, I highly recommend starting the transfer process as early as possible. This not only ensures a smooth transition but also allows you to secure spots for all your classes and build a schedule that fits your lifestyle. Also, maintaining constant communication with transfer advisors at both HCCC and NJCU is crucial to be successful as a transfer student. I recommend attending NJCU orientation sessions because you will talk with advisors from all the departments to answer your questions on the spot. Last, it's important to keep you informed about the application deadlines, class registration timelines, and complete financial aid processes to prevent unnecessary complications.

Transfer Student Timeline

The transfer student timeline is a comprehensive guide that outlines the various stages and key milestones a student typically experiences when transitioning to a new educational institution. This timeline serves as a valuable resource for transfer students, providing them with a clear understanding of what to expect during their journey. Whether you are considering transferring or have already embarked on this path, this timeline will serve as a valuable roadmap to ensure a smooth and successful transition to your new educational destination.

• Research: Start researching potential transfer universities and their transfer requirements, including GPA, prerequisite courses, and application deadlines. Consider factors such as location, program offerings, and financial aid options. Academic Advising: Meet with an academic advisor at the college to discuss your transfer goals. They can guide Early Stages (0-15 credits): you on the appropriate courses to take and ensure you are on track to meet transfer requirements. General Education Courses: Focus on completing your general education requirements, as these are typically transferable to most universities. Consult with your advisor to determine which courses fulfill these requirements. · Target Schools & Career Services: Narrow down your list of potential transfer universities based on your research and personal preferences. Visit their websites and attend transfer information sessions or college fairs to gather more information. Additionally, reach out to your community college's career services department for guidance on how your academic choices align with your long-term career goals. They can provide insights into Mid-Stages (15-30 credits): which universities offer programs that best match your desired career path. Major Exploration: If you have an idea of your intended major, start exploring the prerequisite courses required by your target universities. Ensure that you are taking the necessary courses at your community college. Maintain GPA: Aim to maintain a competitive GPA, as many universities have minimum GPA requirements for transfer students. Strive for a GPA above the minimum requirement to enhance your chances of acceptance. • Transfer Agreements: Check if your community college has any transfer agreements or articulation agreements with specific universities. These agreements outline the courses that will transfer and fulfill major requirements Visit Transfer Offices: Visit the Transfer Pathways office at the college and the universities you are interested in to seek guidance and ensure you are on track. They can provide information on transfer scholarships, housing Preparing for Transfer (30-45 credits): options, and other resources. Additionally, check in with your academic advisor during this stage to discuss your progress, ensure you're meeting the necessary academic requirements, and get their input on your transfer plans. Extracurricular Activities: Engage in extracurricular activities, such as clubs or volunteer work, to enhance your transfer application. These activities demonstrate your involvement and commitment outside of academics. **Application Deadlines:** Be aware of transfer application deadlines for your target universities. Start working on your application well in advance to ensure you have enough time to gather necessary documents, such as transcripts and recommendation letters. Personal Statement: Begin drafting your personal statement, highlighting your academic achievements, extracurricular activities, and reasons for transferring. Seek feedback from advisors, professors, or mentors to **Application and Final Stages** Financial Aid: Research and apply for financial aid and scholarships specific to transfer students. Contact the (45-60 credits): financial aid offices at both your community college and the transfer universities to explore your options. Check with Registrar Office regarding Graduation: As you approach the completion of your community college coursework, check with the Registrar's Office to ensure you are on track for graduation. They can provide guidance on any final requirements and procedures. To complete the graduation process, follow these steps: Visit HCCC.edu-Click on the menu-Select "Student Success"-Click on "Graduation Application."
