Hudson County Community College Practical Nursing Program

At HCCC, students will gain knowledge and experience in the art and science of nursing. Clinical experiences will occur across a variety of healthcare settings including hospitals, nursing homes, and home care agencies. Admission to the program is competitive and requires additional admission testing. The curriculum is <u>challenging</u> and requires dedication to studying and preparation both for class and clinical experiences. The education that one will receive at HCCC will assist the graduate to become a productive member of the nursing profession. The faculty and staff are eager and ready to work with students to encourage both personal and professional growth.

The program consists of both in person classes and lab/clinical practice. There are NO REMOTE or ONLINE classes for clinical courses. General education and science courses are available in person, online and remote. Nursing classes are generally once weekly from 8:30am to 2:30pm. Lab/Clinical are once or twice weekly form 7:00am to 3:00pm. Both class and clinical days can change due to clinical site availability.

Program Objectives

Upon completion of the Practical Nursing program, the graduate will:

- 1. Practice holistic nursing using human needs as a framework.
- 2. Implement caring interventions in a variety of settings based on the nursing process.
- 3. Communicate effectively with clients and members of the interdisciplinary health care team.
- 4. Act in a manner consistent with legal and ethical standards of practice.
- 5. Perform all learned nursing skills safely.
- 6. Meet the cultural/spiritual needs of a diverse population.
- 7. Value critical thinking in the decision-making process.
- 8. Assume responsibility for continuing professional and personal development.

Program Outcomes

- 1. 90% of the graduates will pass the NCLEX- PN Examination on the first attempt.
- 2. Within 9 months of passing the NCLEX-PN 75% of graduates will be employed as licensed Practical Nurses.
- 3. Within one year of graduation, 85% of responding graduates will express satisfaction with the program of study.
- 4. Within one year of employment, 85% of employers will express satisfaction with the graduate's performance.
- 5. Within three years of graduation, 85% of those graduates who enrolled in a RN Program will express satisfaction with the articulation process.

Admission Requirements

HCCC maintains an open admission policy; any residents of Hudson County who is 18 years of age or older with or without a high school diploma may be admitted. All applicants must submit the following items:

- 1. HCCC application
 - > Official copy of High school transcript/diploma or GED
 - > Official transcript of all college credit/transcript

*Foreign college students must have their transcript reviewed and accredited by a member agency of NACES credentialing. A list can be obtained from the office of Enrollment Services or downloaded from <u>www.naces.org/members.html</u>.

- 2. College Placement Test Exit Academic Foundations and/or ESL
- 3. Complete the following three courses with a minimum G.P.A. of 2.0
 - ENG 101 College Composition I
 - MAT 102 Math for Health Sciences or MAT 100 College Algebra
 - Human Biology (If you have completed BIO 211, it will be accepted in place)
 These three courses <u>must</u> be completed <u>before</u> beginning the first nursing course.
- 4. Successful completion of the ATI-TEAS entrance exam. **TEST MUST BE COMPLETED** <u>IN PERSON.</u> <u>http://www.atitesting.com/teas/register</u>

FOLLOWING PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE STUDENTS WILL REQUIRE:

- 5. Health screening; proof of health insurance, CPR certification and professional liability insurance
- 6. Criminal background check with fingerprints

Admission to the program is a competitive process, based on standardized test and academic transcript.

ENTRANCE EXAM


ENTRANCE EXAM:

The Entrance Exam that is used for the Practical Nursing program is the ATI-TEAS exam. The exam is comprised of four main areas: reading, English and language usage, mathematics, which includes basic calculations, word problems, and incorporates algebra, geometry, conversions, graphs, and applied mathematics; and the sciences, which examine general biology, chemistry, physics, and earth science.

A minimum score of 60% is required on each of the sections for the ATI-TEAS: (English and language usage, reading, math, and science).

A test guide is available for purchase thru the college bookstore or from published websites.

The exam is a <u>timed</u> test. Students should prepare themselves and practice taking these tests. Books you may want to purchase to assist you in preparing for the admission test include the following:



TEAS TEST MUST BE DONE <u>IN PERSON</u> AND NOT REMOTELY OR ONLINE.

TRANSFER CREDIT–GENERAL EDUCATION COURSES

An applicant who has completed college level courses from an accredited US college or university will be evaluated for up to 15 general education credits towards a certificate, provided the grade is C or better and, the credits meet the course requirements of the Hudson County Community College.

FUNCTIONAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE NURSING PROGRAM

In order for safe nursing practice to occur and for students to be qualified to participate in and complete the program a nursing student must be able to perform these essential functions. Listed below are the Essential Functions of a student nurse. Applicants need to be aware of these Essential Functions prior to acceptance. Students must be able to perform the essential functions with or without reasonable accommodations. It is the student's responsibility to notify the College of any disability impacting on his or her ability to perform the essential functions prior to entering the Nursing Program.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTION PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

Ability to Use Senses	Visual acuity with corrective lenses to identify color changes in skin, respiratory movement in patients; read fine print / writing on physicians' orders, monitors, equipment calibrations, measure medication in syringes, IV's, etc.
	Hearing ability with auditory aids to hear monitor alarms, emergency signals, call bells, telephone orders; to hear blood pressure, heart, lung and abdominal sounds with a stethoscope; to understand a normal speaking voice without viewing the speaker's face.
	Tactile ability to feel differences in skin temperature and to perform physical assessment.
Motor Ability	Physical ability to walk long distances, to stand for prolonged periods, to lift, move, and transfer patients / equipment of 20 lbs. or more, to maneuver in limited space, to perform CPR, to provide routine and emergency care, to have manual dexterity and feeling ability of the hands to insert tubes, prepare medications, and perform technical skills.
Ability to Communicate	Ability to communicate effectively in English in verbal and written form through interactions with patients, family, and healthcare members from a variety of social, emotional, cultural, and intellectual backgrounds; to write clearly and correctly on patient's record for legal documentation.
Ability to Problem Solve	Intellectual and conceptual ability to think critically in order to make decisions, which includes measuring, calculating, reasoning, analyzing, prioritizing and synthesizing data.
Coping Abilities	Ability to function safely under stress and adapt to changing clinical and patient situations.

NURSING COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

PNU 101 Practical Nursing: Fundamentals of Practice

This introductory nursing course presents basic nursing concepts and skills. The focus is on wellness and disease prevention. Using Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs, concepts basic to physical, psychological, sociocultural, developmental, and spiritual needs are presented. Clinical experiences are provided in varied sites caring for adult and geriatrics clients. These sites include hospitals and nursing homes. Pre-requisites: ENG-101 and MAT-102

PNU 102 Practical Nursing: Nursing Clients with Alterations in Basic Needs 8 CR

This course builds on the knowledge and skills learned in PNU 101. It will focus on acute health problems that occur in adults causing alterations in basic human needs. Mental health concepts and alterations will also be discussed. Clinical experiences are provided in varied sites. Pre-requisite: PNU-101

PNU 201 Practical Nursing: Maternal Child Health

This Nursing course builds on the knowledge and skills learned in PNU 101 and PNU 102. The course focuses on reproduction, childbearing, and child- rearing families. Clinical experiences are provided in varied clinical sites. Pre-requisite: PNU-102

PNU 202 Practical Nursing: Nursing Clients With Complex Needs

This course builds on the knowledge and skills learned in the first three nursing courses. It will focus on chronic and emergent health problems that occur in adults across the life span and cause alterations in basic human needs. Clinical experiences are provided at varied sites.

PNU 203 Practical Nursing: Role Transition

This course will focus on current trends and issues that impact nursing practices and health care delivery. Concepts related to role transition will be explored.

PNU 204 Capstone

This course is a comprehensive synthesis of key practical nursing principles. Aligned with the NCLEX-PN blueprint, students learn about patient safety and content specific to medical/ surgical, maternal/child, and psychiatric nursing care. Clinical simulations and case studies reinforce concepts and focus on prioritization and delegation using multiple patient assignments. NCLEX-PN readiness exams, review, and test taking techniques are integrated to reinforce student learning. Concepts discussed during lecture are reinforced during the lab hours

NJ BOARD OF NURSING REQUIREMENTS TO PRACTICE NURSING

At the conclusion of the nursing program, the graduate must apply for licensure by showing proof of the following items:

- Education: Graduate from a board-approved nursing program
- License exam: Pass the National Council Licensure Exam
- **Background check**: Pass a state and federal criminal background check with fingerprints
- Citizenship: Have a valid Social Security number or Tax ID and be a New Jersey resident
- Criminal record: Have no felony convictions and no misdemeanor convictions related to nursing
